Partnership Formed with Brownell Center

The College of Nursing is partnering with the Brownell Center for Behavioral Health of Liberty Resources to provide primary care to those clients receiving psychiatric mental health care at the center. This unique clinical partnership will allow the College to create a dedicated education unit where faculty can work directly with students in the provision of health care to consumers at the center. Dean Iovce Griffin-Sobel, PhD. RN, has been working closely with Robert Feldman, PhD, LMHC, of Liberty Resources, to create this environment where faculty, students and clinical staff can work together in education, practice and research.

"It is an ideal situation where our faculty and students can clearly see how education, practice and research are an

inseparable trio in providing the best health care to the citizens of Syracuse," Griffin-Sobel said.

According to the dean, the Brownell

Center program will be open to all CON students, but may be of most interest to those in the FNP and FPMHNP programs. Anywhere from five to 10 students each semester will work alongside faculty in patient care. Research projects will focus on quantifying outcomes for the center - e.g., providing primary care access to clients and determining improvements in their health status.

The Brownell Center is the largest community-based outpatient mental health provider in Onondaga County. Treatment is

delivered at the main clinic on James Street, Syracuse, at 12 school-based clinics in the city, and at satellite clinics in Oswego, Oneida and Monroe counties.


Be a Clinical Preceptor -Engage Learning!
