## **College of Health Professions continues to grow**

Exciting things are happening at Upstate's College of Health Professions. The past year has been marked by significant growth and expansion of degree offerings as well as national recognition of well-established programs. Below are just a few of the latest developments.

### New alumni have excellent employment outlook



Last month, 156 degrees were awarded to graduates of the College of Health Professions, including 60 bachelors of science, eight bachelors of professional studies, 39 masters of science and 41 doctorates of physical therapy.

For many Upstate graduates, the job market is booming. For example, students in the Physician Assistant program, who will complete their studies in August, are all but guaranteed a job in their field.

Program director Sandy Banas said the increasing demand for physician assistants is fueled by retirements in the medical field, an aging population in need of more health care and the Affordable Care Act that has provided more people with access to care.

Also highly sought-after are cardiovascular perfusionists. All 10 students in this year's graduating class have job commitments.

Commencement was held at the SRC Arena at Onondaga Community College, marking the first time since 2011 that students from all four colleges were honored during a single ceremony. Receptions for the individual colleges were held the evening prior.

# New master's degree program in Behavior Analysis Studies



A new master's degree program was launched to help address a pressing health concern in New York state. Graduates of the new Behavior Analysis Studies program will be licensed healthcare professionals able to provide therapeutic services for people with autism and

related disorders, with a focus on pediatric patients. Upstate provides a unique and comprehensive environment to prepare students for their future careers, led and facilitated by nationally renowned expert Henry Roane, PhD. Students will also gain first-hand experience working at the Upstate Golisano Children's Hospital.

# New program helps students prepare for medical school

For the first time, the college will offer a oneyear master's degree program designed to enhance a student's skills before they enter medical school. The Medprep Academic Enhancement MS in Medical Technology Program will be a rigorous year of study that also includes a



guaranteed admissions interview at Upstate Medical University's College of Medicine. A master's degree in Medical Technology will be awarded upon completion. The fall 2019 pilot class is expected to have 10 to 15 students.

## Respiratory Therapy program achieves national recognition

The Respiratory Therapy program was named a 2019-2020 Apex Recognition Award winner by the American Association for Respiratory Care (AARC). The award was developed to recognize the contribution of respiratory therapists and to highlight best practices in respiratory care that are aligned with evidence-based medicine.
